In 2016, Ms. Swan opened and oversaw Nevada's first Wet Shelter. Located in the homeless corridor of Las Vegas, the shelter served chronic public inebriates, adults fleeing domestic violence and chronically mentally ill homeless persons. Clients were invited to enter round the clock. Ms. Swan developed and implemented the program from an idea to successfully providing safety, dignity and wrap-around services to an average of 350 clients per month.
